Updated Cell phones in School Policy

In line with new requirements, our cell phone policy at school is still the same - away for the day! Here is our formal policy regarding cell phones and personal digital devices:

Glenbrae School does not allow students to bring personal digital devices to school. These are not necessary to have during the day.

We discuss the school rules about personal digital devices at the beginning of the year, and throughout the year as needed. Any changes to our school rules are communicated to students and our school community.

Parent/Caregiver and student responsibilities

If a parent/caregiver needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the office.

If a student brings a personal digital device to our school, the following guidelines apply:

- The school does not accept responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen personal digital devices brought to the school but investigates any issues as appropriate.
- Should a student bring in a personal digital device, they must hand in their device to the office or their teacher at the beginning of the day, and can collect the device at the end of the day.

Personal digital devices may not be taken on EOTC events.

Students are expected to follow our **Digital Technology and Online Safety** policy when using personal digital devices on school property or the school network.

Inappropriate use

If we see a student using a personal digital device inappropriately, we confiscate it. After the student locks the device, we place it in the office to be collected at the end of the day.

Ongoing Key Reminders and Notices

Vaping or smoking on school grounds is completely unacceptable at Glenbrae School. Students who bring these items to school will face the consequences for doing so.

If you have changed any of your contact details please keep the office informed. We need to be able to contact you in an emergency and these details are vital to be kept updated!

Absences - please call the office on 09 528 5025 if your child is not coming to school that day. If we do not hear from you, we will txt you and after numerous days away, we may have to place a referral to our attendance service for follow up.

Fizzy drink, lollies, chocolate, chewing gum etc are a big NO NO at school. If found, they will be confiscated and returned at the end of each day. We look forward to your support on this. We supply free lunches so there is no need to drop off lunch if you child has forgotten it that day!

Keep it named! Please name every piece of uniform your child has. This makes it so much easier to find when your little one may have left something behind.

Valuables/money/phones that get brought to school and get lost are completely the child's responsibility and the school will not search for or be responsible for these lost items if they are brought to school!

Students are not permitted to bring mobile phones/smart watches to school. If they bring one, they need to hand it to their teacher to look after during the day.

Glenbrae School has a uniform which is available for purchasing at the office. The correct school uniform needs to be worn every day, which includes a Glenbrae School hat during Terms 1 and 4.

OPEN DOOR POLICY Our school runs on an "Open Door Policy". This means that should you have any questions or concerns about anything please do not hesitate to contact us. Don't be a stranger, but pop in anytime you can. We'd love to see you! If at any time you wish to see any of your child's teachers about something specific please telephone the school to organize an appointment. At times there are bound to be issues that crop up and we encourage you to air your concerns but ask that you speak to the person involved first. If you have done this and feel there has been no success, you are more than welcome to see the relevant senior staff member or myself. If you are wanting information on your child's progress, it is advisable to book a time to see teacher. This will enable the teacher to give you the time you deserve to have the proper conversation. Classrooms are busy places in the mornings before school and immediately after, and it is not always possible for the teacher to give full attention to your queries if you do not book in advance.

All visitors to the school must sign in at the office upon arrival. This includes your high school aged students who return back to school!

Uniform Reminders

Please ensure your child is wearing black shoes to school please. This is our school uniform. Please see some examples on what black school shoes are acceptable. Glenbrae School's uniform is the same for boys and girls, with girls having the option of wearing shorts or the skort. We encourage parents to purchase at least two school uniform T-shirts which have the school logo and a school uniform blue jumper which has our school logo on it. The black school shorts are to be worn in the summer months. Plain black trousers/long pants can be worn during the winter terms which are Term 2 and Term 3.

Our children in Room 1 are enjoying school after the two week break. They are also looking after and taking care of our little new children that have come in this term. 

Welcome to Room 2's newsletter! Let's start off with showing you all how amazing our writing is! We have enjoyed learning about trigraphs and digraphs. This term we are looking into doing split digraphs! It is important for us to understand split digraphs because they improve our reading fluency and help us pronounce words correctly.



In Maths, we have started a new unit focused on multiplication and division. We are enjoying working collaboratively and solving problems as a team. Our focus is on learning how to use grouping strategies to solve addition and multiplication problems without counting each object individually. This approach is important because it helps us solve problems faster!



We have enjoyed our in-class support sessions with Mr Goodwin. He is teaching us how to use basic features on our iPads so we can create and share our work! How exciting!

Get ready for an inspiring event in Week 5! We are hosting our United Nations Assembly, where students will showcase their understanding of global issues and celebrate the diversity of our school community. It's an event you won't want to miss!



ROOM SIX - NEWSLETTER!

Welcome back everyone! We have had a great start to Term 3 and the children have been engaged in some exciting learning. We are continuing to develop our Glenbrae School Values across all areas of the school day please continue to support this at home with your children.

This term our key areas of learning includes the following:

Writing	Descriptive writing - including similes, metaphors and personification etc and using their senses. Plays - learning to perform and create plays to share with others. Speeches - creating a speech that can be shared with others.
Reading	Continuing to read a range of texts and develop reading skills and strategies around reading. Sharing their knowledge and understanding of what they have read through a range of reading tasks. To read/be read to for pleasure to support reading including visits to the school library and Waka Library throughout the term.
Maths	Continuing to build on number knowledge - basic facts and multiplication and division. Multiplication and division - focusing on strategies to help solve problems. We will follow this on with a unit on Space and Shape.
Inquiry	We have started off the term by looking at 2 United Nations Andorra and Paraguay. Learning about the cultures and traditions and then creating a 'performance' item which we hope to share with you in Week 5.
The Code	Continuing to develop the learning and use of spelling in the classroom through a range of spelling tasks and online materials to help with this learning. This will help improve spelling across the class and assist students with the use of this over other subjects as well.
Fitness/PE	What helps us to keep fit and why is it important? We are doing a number of activities both inside and outside (weather dependent) to help to improve fitness in the class. We have had some great sessions with the Kiwi Sports team coming in weekly to help with skills and facilitating games that use these skills
Cybersmart	As part of Cybersmart awareness in our class Mr Goodwin is coming into support in Room 6. Throughout this term he will be sharing a range of topics to enable Room 6 to become more confident, assess sites and work safely in the classroom.

Assemblies - will continue to be held fortnightly in the hall from 145pm to about 235pm - please feel welcome to come to any of these. If your child is receiving a certificate Mr Te Aotonga will aim to be in contact with you before Friday's Assembly to let you know should you also wish to attend.

Just a few reminders:

- School starts at 8.55am. It would be great if we could see as many children here on time or at school before the bell goes so they have time to settle and prepare for the start of the school day.
- If your child is late to school, absent or needs to go home before the school bell at 2.45pm please let the Office know.

What's happening in Room 11?

Kia ora Room 7 Whanau!

We have settled into term 3 well, kicking start the term by moving into our newly renovated classroom and getting to know each other. Here is a preview of what we have been getting up to:

In maths, we have been learning about decimals and percentages. We have linked our fraction knowledge, showing how they can be converted to decimals and percentages. We have also begun working on speeding up our multiplication and division recall to help us solve more complex mathematical problems.

In writing, we have been working on our descriptive language. We've started by exploring the use of sensory phrases and figurative language. This will help us create some great setting descriptions.

This term's inquiry project will see us learning about performing arts in Sri Lanka. We have embarked on our journey by researching Sri Lankan culture and discussing performing arts. We've also begun research on Raksha and Sanni Mask. I can't wait to see how this learning develops.







We are working hard on our relationships with each other. Making sure we are kind and respectful to each other at all times.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN

5th August 2024 ROOM 12?

WELCOME TO TERM 3! OUR FIRST DAY AT SCHOOL BEGAN WITH AN EXCITING MOVE AS ROOM 8 TRANSITIONED INTO OUR BRAND NEW CLASSROOM, ROOM 12. WE ARE FORTUNATE TO HAVE A FRESH LEARNING SPACE WITH NEW FURNITURE. OUR STUDENTS HAVE BEEN DILIGENT IN TAKING CARE OF OUR NEW CLASSROOM, ENSURING IT REMAINS A WONDERFUL ENVIRONMENT FOR LEARNING.

THIS TERM, WE HAVE EMBARKED ON OUR NEW INQUIRY MODULE ABOUT THE UNITED NATIONS, AND ROOM 12'S FOCUS COUNTRY IS
AFGHANISTAN. WE HAVE COMPLETED OUR INITIAL WONDERINGS ABOUT AFGHANISTAN AND ARE NOW MOVING INTO THE
INVESTIGATION PHASE. STUDENTS ARE RESEARCHING VARIOUS ASPECTS OF THE COUNTRY, DIVING INTO WHAT THEY WANT TO
LEARN AND DISCOVER ABOUT AFGHANISTAN!

IN WRITING, WE ARE FOCUSING ON DESCRIPTIVE WRITING, WHERE STUDENTS ARE LEARNING TO PAINT VIVID IMAGES IN THE READER'S MIND BY USING LANGUAGE FEATURES AND INCORPORATING THEIR FIVE SENSES.

IN MATHS, WE ARE LEARNING ABOUT PERCENTAGES AND DECIMALS. STUDENTS ARE FOCUSING ON CONVERTING DECIMALS TO PERCENTAGES AND MAKING CONNECTIONS WITH FRACTIONS. THEY ARE EXPLORING HOW THESE MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS ARE INTERRELATED AND APPLYING THEM TO REAL-WORLD SCENARIOS. THROUGH VARIOUS ACTIVITIES AND EXERCISES, STUDENTS ARE DEVELOPING A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF HOW TO USE PERCENTAGES AND DECIMALS IN EVERYDAY SITUATIONS, SUCH AS CALCULATING DISCOUNTS, UNDERSTANDING STATISTICS, AND COMPARING DATA.

IN KELLY SPORTS, OUR FOCUS IS ON RUGBY. STUDENTS ARE LEARNING AND PRACTICING KEY SKILLS SUCH AS PASSING, TACKLING, AND STRATEGIC GAMEPLAY. THEY ARE WORKING ON DEVELOPING THEIR TEAMWORK, COORDINATION, AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE RULES, ALL WHILE BUILDING THEIR PHYSICAL FITNESS AND ENJOYING THE SPIRIT OF THE GAME.
